ISMA MEMBERSHIP AND MAGAZINE CIRCULATION POLICY

Active membership in the International Six Metre Association qualifies each member for receipt of the "ISMA" official Class magazine. Active membership in the Association is franchised through the respective national fleets, or where no national body exists directly with the office of the executive secretary of ISMA. Active membership is open to all Six Metre owners, sailors, and other interested parties wishing to receive the Class magazine and to maintain contact with the official Class body. Active membership in ISMA entitles each member to receive the magazine, ISMA Class business reports, and other mailings; except that only yacht owners are franchised through their national fleet or directly to the executive secretary of ISMA if no national fleet association exists, to vote on ISMA Class business.

ISMA membership dues are \$8.00 for a two year membership period corresponding with the term of the elected officers; currently mid-1974 to mid-1976. Dues cover the costs of class mailings, class official correspondences, and the publication and mailing of the "ISMA" Class magazine. As the magazine is published bi-annually the dues cover the costs of printing and mailing of four issues of "ISMA" to your doorstep.

Mailing will be direct to each active individual member. An official ISMA membership/mailing form is attached. Please fill in all of the required information and return it to the International Six Metre Association before December 1, 1974 to insure active enrollment in ISMA and to insure that you will receive the second half 1974 issue of the magazine. Enclose the membership dues.

An official directory of yachts will be published in the second half 1975 issue of the magazine giving the following information / National Fleet affiliation, yacht name and number, previous names of yacht, yacht owner, owner's address, yacht designer and builder, year built, etc.

The "ISMA" magazine will be mailed to individual active members of ISMA only. No extra copies of the magazine will be available for general purchase by non-members or by members unless sufficient extra copies are available. Charges for these extra copies, if any, will be \$3.00 per issue plus mailing.

The Puget Sound Six Metre Association has voted a special gift of \$200.00 to ISMA for the printing and mailing of this prospectus.

The feature article in each issue of "ISMA" will be printed in both the English language and in the German language for those more comfortable with a language common to the European Continent.
