## End of the Clyde Season

FROM OUR YACHTING CORRESPONDENT It was unfortunate that in a Clyde season which has been notably free from protests at least six boats on Saturday returned flying the black flag in the last race of the year-the Royal Northern Yacht Club's regatta at Helensburgh.
