Dear Sir,

Seawanhaka Cup.

I have the honour to inform you that "Coila III" has been chosen to defend the Seawanhaka Cup for the Royal Northern Yacht Club. She will be steered by her owner, Mr. F.J. Stephen, Vice-Commodore of the Club.

The Races are to be sailed on Saturday, 25th. August, Monday, the 27th., and subsequent days; and I am instructed by the Committee of the Royal Northern Yacht Club to request that spectators intending to view the Races will keep clear of the competing yachts.

The Races will be sailed in the waters between Rothesay, Skelmorlie, and the Greater Cumbrae, the course being determined each day, according to the weather prevailing. As it is expected that there may be a number of spectators, I am instructed earnestly to request that owners of motor boats &c. will kindly refrain from encroaching on the course or from proceeding at more than a very moderate speed in its vicinity, as the wash from these boats, especially in calm weather, interferes with the progress of the yachts, and may ruin a race.
